BSSF Jeopardy for February 2024

Answer: May 2015

Question: When was the last time we saw Jason Mellica?

After a nearly 9-year drought, Jason returned to the BSSF from Sarasota to update his earlier topic, “Rise of the Tiger Neoregelia Hybrid.” A lot has been going on in the interim.

Jason started hybridizing 15-20 years ago, but recommitted during COVID. He learned about bromeliads while an intern at Selby Gardens. Grant Groves was an early inspiration. Thirty years later, Jason possesses 30,000 plants. That’s a lot of inspiration! He considers himself a Level 2 hybridizer and hopes to produce more variegated hybrids over the next 4-5 years. Strong, colorful hybrids are his goal.

Neos and other genera are slow from seed until about age 2. Tigers can take a lot of sun, and their formidable spines are becoming more popular. Stoloniferous Neos, such as *N. ampullacea*, are a bonus. Doubters said that Tigers wouldn’t hybridize well with colorful species, but that proved wrong. *N. ‘Omicron’* (‘Cat’s Pajamas’ X ‘Artemis’) has been a great COVID-era cross.

Jason and the Argonauts, from Greek mythology, has been a source of names for Jason’s crosses. Continuing in the same vein, his *N. ‘Poseidon’s Poison’* has proven to be a good hybrid; it’s a wide-growing plant.

‘Advanced Traits’ is Jason’s term for a hybrid that pups before it flowers. *N. ‘Lava Lamp’* has wild patterns and possesses advanced traits. Another cross, *N. ‘Waves of Zanzibar,’* is brand-new. *N. ‘Dark Matter’* is an appropriately-named cross with advanced traits. Then there’s *N. ‘Elvira,’* which is, as its name suggests, very dark. It’s distinguished by an upright growth habit.

Jason has been so busy making crosses during the COVID era that there are some 30 that he still has to name. His motto in hybridizing is, “Use the best material.” He likes making crosses from Lisa Vinzant’s plants. A ‘Crimson Tide’ X ‘Artemis’ hybrid, yet to be named, is promising. He also likes hybridizing with Roy Coleman’s plants, which tend to contribute striations. And he’d like to do more work with Australian hybrids.

Not surprisingly, Chester Skotak's name also comes up as a source of material. Years ago he found five or six *N. carcharodon* varieties in Brazil that have become the source of numerous crosses. The plants are large and spiny, with wide, thick leaves.

Jason then turned to cultural topics.

Fertilizer: He uses Dynamite, 4-10 pellets per plant. He fertilizes with each repotting, because it initiates rapid growth and lasts 3-6 months. He does *not* apply fertilizer in the crown of plants; while it might stimulate pups, it can also burn. He adds that users of liquid fertilizer can spray the whole plant without incurring risk.

Soil: Jason uses a mix of $\frac{3}{4}$ peat moss and $\frac{1}{4}$ perlite (sometimes less). The sterile mix means minimal weeds -- mostly ferns.

Pest control: He discourages scale on dying bromeliads by removing old leaves to create better aeration. White scale is the easiest to deal with. Black scale is a much bigger problem, but brown scale is the worst, because it can eat holes in leaves. Separation of plants helps discourage scale infestation. Pups tend not to attract scale, so Jason sometimes keeps the pup and throws out the mother plant.
