

### In Case You Missed It:

David Sands gave an insightful and handson demonstration on hybridizing bromeliads during our last Bromeliad Society meeting. He expertly showcased a variety of stunning specimens, and attendees had the exciting opportunity to purchase rare varieties to enhance their own collections.

Sands walked us through the intricate process of hybridization, emphasizing the

importance of precision tools, such as sharp scissors and tweezers. He explained the roles of the male (stamen) and female (pistil) parts of the plant. To begin, he demonstrated how to carefully remove the bracts and peel away the petals while leaving the female portion of the flower intact. He emphasized that removing the male parts ensures the plant does not self-pollinate. This work should be done early in the morning for the best results.

Once the male parts are removed, Sands explained the process of dabbling pollen onto a tag and placing it gently on the female pistil. It doesn't take much pollen to achieve pollination. Afterward, it's crucial to label the cross and note the date of pollination. Sands also mentioned that it can take 2-3 months for the seeds to ripen, which will be evident when they appear swollen. Once ripe, the seeds can be squeezed out, cleaned off, and rinsed with water before being placed on a coffee filter to dry.

Sands also highlighted that certain types of bromeliads, like Dyckia and Tillandsia, take longer to grow, and that bromeliads in general can be difficult to work with when extracting pollen. When it comes to growing the seedlings, he recommended picking the largest ones first and isolating those with desirable characteristics, such as unique coloring. Seedlings may take 2-3 years to mature into full plants, but regular attention and selective growing will yield the best results.

Fertilization plays a role, but Sands advised caution, noting that fertilizing too soon could mask some of the natural coloring of the plants. Once the characteristics of the seedlings are clear, fertilization can be adjusted as needed. He also recommended using moisture-holding soil for

seedlings, and for best results, placing them in a plastic bag with soil to create a mini greenhouse environment.

Importantly, Sands cautioned against using albomarginated plants for hybridizing, as they tend to produce albino plants that won't survive. He also noted that most bigeneric hybrids do not germinate. Overall, the session was filled with valuable advice and practical techniques that attendees can apply to their own bromeliad hybridization efforts.

We look forward to seeing the future results of this exciting session as our members experiment with hybridization techniques and continue to grow their collections.

### **Hotel Reservations**

The special hotel room rate for Conference registrants is only \$85.80 per night (\$67.80 plus \$18 resort fee) plus 13.5% taxes. This rate includes free parking and breakfast discounts. Deluxe tower rooms are also available for only \$105 (\$87 plus \$18 resort fee). Rooms are King or 2 Queen bed rooms.

The hotel is the **Ramada Gateway**, 7470 W Irlo Bronson Memorial Hwy 192, Kissimmee, FL 34747. To obtain the conference rate, call the hotel (407-396-4400 or 407-997-6662 from 9am to 5pm) and ask for the special **Bromeliad Extravaganza** rates.

A deposit for one night's room rate plus taxes (\$67.80 plus \$9.16 or \$76.96 for the courtyard or poolview rooms) will be required at the time of booking (refundable up until 72 hours before the scheduled arrival date). The special rates will also be available from Sept. 23rd to 30th for those who would like to make a vacation out of their stay, but you need to book before August 26th to get this special rate. Hotel check-in time is 4pm and check out time is 11am.

You should book the hotel as soon as possible.
