<u>Tillandsia simulata</u>

The native *Tillandsia simulata* is Florida's only endemic bromeliad. It is an epiphyte known to grow on branches of various trees and shrubs in many counties in central Florida, mostly in swamps and other moist locations, and is easily recognized by its narrow elliptic leaf sheath. In the spring it produces inflorescences up to 6 inches long with rose-colored bracts and conspicuous violet flowers. You can't tell from the photo but after blooming, capsules form that are filled with hundreds of feathery plumes like dandelion seeds. I read a trick to save the seeds before they blow away. You should attach a paper bag around the inflorescence before it explodes so you can share the seeds with your friends.

The photo is a plant that I won in the bromeliad raffle in 2017. I have grown it in a wooden slatted basket which hangs from my Savannah holly in the south garden.

Don't forget to start designing your bromeliad centerpiece!

At the July meeting we will have a center piece competition like we have had in the past at our Christmas party. However, don't decorate it for Christmas, but use your imagination and create a design for a special prize.
