

Horticulturist Brian Kemble gave us a fascinating talk about the puyas in Ruth Bancroft's garden in Walnut Creek, CA. We learned about the majestic xeric garden created by Ms. Bancroft, and how it developed and matured over the decades. Starting most of her plants from seed or seedlings, she saw a plant that takes many years to mature as a welcome challenge, not a problem. Puyas fall perfectly in this description, as they are best grown from seed and take many years to show their charms. Over there, they grow 25 different puyas, forming large beds that flower profusely in the mild dry climate. Brian brought an excellent slideshow to illustrate the presentation, and now we all want to go to the garden and see the mighty puyas in person! Thanks Andrew Wilson for arranging this wonderful talk.

Plant Table




