Dr. Terrie Bert will present "Growing Bromeliads in West-Central Florida." She will bring about 200 Bromeliads from many different genera and talk about growing them in our area. These plants will also be for sale, so you'll have the opportunity to purchase your favorites. Terrie will also include information on the ecology and history of the various genera, as well as humorous stories about growing bromeliads. This is a great opportunity to add a variety of beautifully grown bromeliads from a variety of genera to your collection.

Dr. Terrie Bert is a long-standing member of the Sarasota Bromeliad Society (SBS) and the Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society (CBS) and has held multiple offices in the SBS. She also served the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies (FCBS) as a representative and had held multiple officer for eight years and has authored multiple articles for the FCBS newsletter. For the Bromeliad Society International, she has served on the library committee, and has been a Florida Director. She has chaired several international committees, judged several shows, contributed articles to the BSI Journal, and has been an invited speaker at world conferences. Currently she is Curator of the Wally Berg Award of Excellence, Chair for the Judged Show at the 2022 BSI World Conference, and a Master Judge. Terrie has given over 175 presentations on bromeliads to numerous U.S. and international bromeliad societies and to other groups, including regional and international bromeliad conferences. She cultivates more than 2000 different bromeliads in about 35 genera. She's won multiple top awards in local bromeliad shows and BSI world conferences. She also recently obtained her Master Naturalist certification from the Manatee County Extension Service. Terrie has a Ph.D. in marine biology and recently retired from her position as a research scientist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

If you are interested in bromeliads, you are invited to join the Sarasota Bromeliad Society. We meet on the second Monday of the month at 6 PM in the Great Room at Marie Selby Botanical Gardens. 


